### CURRENT GUIDELINES REGARDING FOOD SERVICE

During September, <u>food and beverages</u> (other than student on-campus dining) should be consumed outdoors or in private workspaces. When food is consumed indoors, there should be ample physical distance among those sharing dining areas. Because of CMU's reinstitution of the face covering requirement, also through September, it is strongly recommended that food not be served at indoor events regardless of event size.

Food (including take-out and catered) should be individually wrapped/sealed and should not be consumed in classrooms. Alcohol is currently prohibited.
