## REMINDER: CMU'S VACCINATION REQUIREMENT

Faculty and staff: upload confirmation of your vaccination status to the <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Database</u> before September 30. <u>Schedule an appointment</u> during CMU's <u>final free vaccine clinic of the month</u> on Friday, September 24, 1 - 4 p.m.

## **WEAR YOUR MASK ON CAMPUS**

Whether vaccinated or unvaccinated, you must <u>wear a facial covering</u> sufficient to cover your nose and mouth when on campus. Exceptions are only while eating or drinking or when alone in an office, assigned residence hall room or enclosed vehicle. When outdoors, facial coverings are expected to be worn if physical distancing of at least six feet cannot be maintained.
